

Our college is affiliated to Solapur University, Solapur. We implement the syllabi designed by the Boards of Studies of the University. However, some of our faculty is actively involved in the development of curriculum as chair persons and members of Boards of Studies and as members of syllabi framing sub-committees.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning:

The Principal of our college manages Teaching and Learning Process with the help of following:

As a result, semester examinations are conducted at the end of each semester. Besides the university examinations, Mid-term exams are also conducted at the college level to check the progress of the students. Home Assignments are given to students and seminars are conducted for the final year students.

# Statistical Analysis of Feed-Back of Students (2017-2018)

For the purpose of feedback of the teachers from the students, a feedback form under UGC norms is prepared. These forms are distributed among the students randomly in the class room. The form covers five aspects for Arts faculty namely TIME SENSE, SUBJECT COMMAND, USE OF TEACHING METHODS, HELPING ATTITUDE, CLASS CONTROL. For science faculty along with these five aspects one more aspect is taken into consideration namely LABORATORY INTERACTION. The completed forms are then analyzed using Four point criteria scaled as "Totally Agree ": 4 points , " Agree ": 3 points , " Totally Disagree ": 1 point.
